Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have increased by 16
- There were no Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have remained the same
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 1

AS3A - Summary - There were several proactive Police generated incidents in relation to road traffic offences. Acquisitive crime is a continual issue and **I would ask all local residents to ensure their vehicles, garages and vehicles are locked.** I would ask all residents to remain vigilant and report any suspicious persons, activities or vehicles to Police on 999 (on going) or 101.

AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have increased by 6
- There were no Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have increased by 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have reduced by 2

AS3B - Summary - Acquisitive crime featured prominently in the AS3B beat including theft. One

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male was reported in relation to bike theft and will be dealt with by the court on a later date. I would like to reiterate a message consistently sent by Police Service of Scotland. **Please ensure all residents lock their vehicles, houses and garages. Please ensure the keys for these items are kept in a safe, secure place.**

AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have increased by 13
- There was 1 Housebreaking to a house and 1 to a shed.
- Vandalisms have increased by 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 5

AS3C - Summary - There were eight vandalisms in the area over the report period including a crime series where the paint work of vehicles was scratched. I would ask all residents to remain vigilant and report any suspicious persons, activities or vehicles to Police at the time they are seeing anything suspicious. 999 (o going) or 101.

Operation LATHE

Can I please make you aware of Operation LATHE. Over the month of June a small dedicated team will be robustly tackling push bike crime. We will focus on three strands of intelligence, prevention and enforcement.

Can I ask that if you see anyone acting suspiciously in your area you contact Police on 999 for on-going incidents or 101 for historical.

Our team is committed to keeping the community safe, preventing and detecting crime. If any suspicious activity is seen, please report this to us, either as an emergency on 999 or to the Service Centre on 101. Quick and effective reporting allows our team to react accordingly and maximise the opportunity to apprehend offenders.

The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.

Your comments and concerns are important to the staff of the West End CPT. This allows us to allocate our resources to the areas causing you the most concern.
