The following is a summary of Quality of Life incidents between 01/04/2016 and 29/04/2016, within the West End Community Policing area:

Most of the areas have seen a fall in the number of quality of life calls. The rise in motorcycle calls is to be expected as the weather improves (!) and Aberdeen City have instigated Operation Trinity once more which is our response to motorcycle nuisance calls. The team pull together incidents so that if there are opportunities for intervention or prosecution, this is done.

The increase in public nuisance calls in AS3A is mainly attributable to minor youth annoyance during the school holidays.

#### Streets with more than one incident are as follows:

The incidents on Holburn Street occurred at different locations are unrelated and involved no criminality.

The Caledonian Place calls occurred over two days and related to youth annoyance at Ferryhill Primary during the school holidays.

An overall drop in crime again this month in every area except AS3A.

The Vandalisms there related to a single incident, and are all detected with the offender having been kept as a custody for court.

**Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:**

**AS3A – Ferryhill**

- Quality of life calls have increased by 7
- There were 0 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have increased by 7
- There were 2 Thefts from vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 15

**AS3B – Mannofield**

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 9
- There were 2 Housebreakings (1 garage, 1 house)
- Vandalisms have decreased by 2
- There was 1 Theft from vehicle
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 5

**AS3C – West End**

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 2
- There was 1 Housebreaking (garage)
- Vandalisms have remained the same
- There were 0 Thefts from vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 8

The primary purpose of these e-mail addresses is for residents to report non-criminal queries, such as passing attentions, information, advice and non-criminal quality of life issues, such as youth annoyance. These e-mail addresses are not for reporting crimes or offences. The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.

Your comments and concerns are important to the staff of the West End CPT. This allows us to allocate our resources to the areas causing you the most concern.
