There was a slight rise in calls to the AS3A area but a reduction elsewhere. The public nuisance calls occurred at different locations, dates and times, and are not linked.

Again, there was a slight rise in calls to the AS3A area but a reduction elsewhere. We continue to actively focus on the areas where acquisitive crime is occurring with extra patrols and leaflet drops.

**Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:**

**AS3A – Ferryhill**

- Quality of life calls have increased by 20
- There were 3 Housebreakings (1 house & 2 garages)
- Vandalisms have increased by 1
- There were 3 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 7

**AS3B – Mannofield**

## **NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED**

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 6
- There was 1 Housebreaking (1 house)
- Vandalisms have decreased by 1
- There were 0 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 13

### **AS3C – West End**

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 5
- There were 3 Housebreaking (1 house, 2 garages)
- Vandalisms have increased by 1
- There were 2 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 3

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

As you will know from reading previous documents, over the last few weeks we have raised the issue of garages and sheds being broken into and bicycles being stolen.

Since the start of July we have had a plan in place to try and tackle this. It comprises of additional patrols on the dates and times our analysts tell us are the 'at risk' periods, additional media releases and social media messages relating to bike and garage security and also liaising with bike clubs and retailers to try and get a suitable message at point of sale.

This will continue into August, when it will be reviewed.

The best advice is still to have good security and lighting around your property and to report anything or anyone suspicious at the time - we will do our very best to give a quick response, and indeed a number of successes have come from this very scenario.

For those in the Seafield and Craigiebuckler Community Council area, you should note that PI Kenny McGeough has moved to another role, and in the interim I am looking after both the Hazlehead and West End CPT's.

The primary purpose of these e-mail addresses is for residents to report non-criminal queries, such as passing attentions, information, advice and non-criminal quality of life issues, such as youth annoyance. The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.
