Quality of Life Calls

The high numbers of quality of life calls originate from the exceptionally high number of Public Nuisance type calls. A more detailed examination shows that over 12 of these calls are to do with the Willows residential home. In order to address this problem, we have allocated Pc John Hampton as a Single Point of Contact between the home and ourselves. Together we will work hard to solve this ongoing problem. The only upside being the calls very rarely effect the local neighbourhood; rather they are confined to the home itself.

The five nuisance calls to the West end pertain exclusively to drunk people returning from a night out in the city centre.

We are asking our Officers to show more of a presence around these busy times.

Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have reduced by 23
- There were two Housebreaking calls
- Vandalisms have reduced by 8
- Thefts of or from vehicles reduced by 3
- Overall CrimeFile offences have reduced by 8

AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have increased by 3
- There was 1 Housebreaking call
- Vandalisms have increased by 2
- Thefts of or from vehicles have reduced by 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have remained the same at 7

AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have increased by 2
- There were no Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have reduced by 3
- Thefts of or from vehicles has increased by 5
- Overall CrimeFile offences have reduced by 2

GENERAL INFORMATION AND UPDATE ON PREVIOUS QUERIES

There are no queries raised from the previous period.

During March we ran two high profile, community led operations.

During the night of the 7th, Officers walked the Ferryhill area, first in plain clothes in order to detect and deter criminals. Thereafter in uniform, where they discovered 11 unsecured cars. The keepers of these cars were woken and given suitable advice. Although the patrols were not primarily aimed at trying car doors, once one vehicle was found, it felt imperative to try others. The very fact that 11 cars were found open within a few streets highlights the continuing problem and the need to reinforce the 'lock it or lose it' message at every opportunity.

On the morning of the 19th Officers from Nigg and Whinhill Community Policing Teams, joined forces in order to conduct a 'morning after' vehicle check, located on Great Southern Road, Aberdeen.

Random vehicles were stopped and the drivers spoken to. This was to facilitate a check of the vehicles tyres, but also to engage with the drivers about being over the limit the next morning. 11 Drivers were breathalysed, none provided a positive result. It was good to see that no other offences were found

We are only able to run these types of operation, in response to your concerns, when we are not dealing with crimes that could have been prevented. Please ensure that you secure your home and car.

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Our team at Whinhill are committed to keeping the community safe, preventing and detecting crime. If any suspicious activity is seen, please report this to us, either as an emergency on 999 or to the Service Centre on 101. Quick and effective reporting allows our team to react accordingly and maximise the opportunity to apprehend offenders.
