Summary

There were 2 reports of Theft by Housebreaking in the Ferryhill area. Community Policing Team Officers are currently progressing these enquiries.

There were 5 reports of Theft by Housebreaking in the Mannofield area to a mixture of houses and garages. Enquiries are on-going and being dealt with by Community Policing Team Officers.

There were 4 reports of Theft by Housebreaking in the West End. These enquiries are being dealt with by Community Policing Officers.

Push bike thefts continue to feature in the above crimes.

There were no section 57 (persons on property with the intention to commit theft) offences over the reporting period.

There were no incidents in relation to drugs in the Ferryhill area.

There was 1 incidents in relation to drugs reported in the Mannofield area which related to a male potentially smoking cannabis.

There were 2 incidents recorded in relation to drugs in the West End. Police attended both calls which were on separate days at separate locations. One male required Ambulance assistance and for the other persons were stopped, searched and dealt with for traffic and drug offences.

There were 10 reports of anti-social behaviour in the Ferryhill area. These appear to be separate incidents ranging from a report of buzzers being pressed, a male being threatened in a shop and a drunk female being dealt with for anti-social behaviour.

There was 1 reports of anti-social behaviour in the Mannofield area. This relates to a youth in possession of a BB gun.

There were 10 reports of anti-social behaviour in the West End including youths throwing snowballs and persons ringing and knocking on doors.

There were 7 reported vandalism in the Ferryhill area. A 29 year old female has been dealt with for damaging a number of vehicles in the area.

There were 2 reports of vandalism in the Mannofield area which also relates to vehicle damage. The enquiries are on-going.

There were 4 reported vandalism in the West End in relation to damaged vehicles. All enquiries are on-going.

There have been no significant road traffic accidents in the area over the month of December 2017.

Over the reporting period Police have reported individuals for a number of crimes / offences including Road Traffic offences, Assault, Vandalism, Theft and Domestic incidents.

Our team is committed to keeping the community safe, preventing and detecting crime. If any suspicious activity is seen, please report this to us, either as an emergency on 999 or to the Service Centre on 101. Quick and effective reporting allows our team to react accordingly and maximise the opportunity to apprehend offenders.

Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.
