The number of quality of life calls has fallen this month except for public nuisance calls which have risen slightly. There is no pattern to the rise and the vast majority of the calls involved no criminality and related to members of the public reporting concern for drunk people in the areas.

Streets with more than one incident are as follows:

The incidents on Holburn Street occurred at different locations are unrelated and involved no criminality.

Likewise, the Crown Street calls were unrelated and were resolved without Police attendance.

Other than the rise caused by the detected drugs possession offences, AS3A and AS3B both saw a fall in acquisitive crime, however AS3C still continues to be targeted. I will go into more detail in the summary below.

Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have increased by 1
- There was 1 Housebreaking
- Vandalisms have increased by 1
- There was 1 Theft from vehicle
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 3

AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 2
- There was 1 Housebreaking
- Vandalisms have decreased by 2
- There were 2 Thefts from vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 3

AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have increased by 5
- There were 9 Housebreakings (8 to garages)
- Vandalisms have remained at 2
- There were 11 Thefts from vehicles (8 detected)
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 16

GENERAL INFORMATION

As you know, we saw a small but steady rise last month in garages in lanes at the rear of properties are being targeted. These are also occurring in other CPT's. While it is rarely high value, the annoyance and frustration caused by these crimes is appreciated and we instigated Operation Manoso, which pulls together Officers from a number of different CPT's and CID to focus on these crime types for the next few weeks.

So far it has seen some early success, detecting all 6 of the OLP referred to above, which happened in the Albyn area. In addition, some good work from CPT Officers and a vigilant member of the public resulted in two males being charged with three of Theft by HB from garages in lanes in the Forest Avenue area.

As stated last week, the best defences are still a good lock (if used), and vigilant neighbours. If someone is hanging around your street and it doesn't feel right - trust your instincts and let us know.

The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.

Your comments and concerns are important to the staff of the West End CPT. This allows us to allocate our resources to the areas causing you the most concern.
