Summary

There was one report of Theft by Housebreaking to a commercial premise in the West End area over the reporting period. Enquiries are on-going.

There was a reduction of section 57 offences in the West End area with one recorded which was detected by Police.

There were three incidents in relation to drugs in the West End area. These relate to three separate unrelated incidents. There is an on-going enquiry in relation to three persons being concerned in the supply of controlled drugs.

There was a reduction of anti-social behaviour calls in the West End area. The majority of calls refer to youth annoyance.

There were two vandalisms in the West End area; one refers to damage to a vehicle, the other to minor damage to a small tree / shrub. The second incident was detected.

Reported Road traffic collisions remain at the same level with no significant road traffic accidents in the area over the month of September 2017.

Over the reporting period Police have reported individuals for a number of crimes / offences including Road Traffic offences, Assault, Vandalism, Theft, Drugs, Anti-Social Behaviour and Domestic incidents.

Officers will continue to be encouraged to utilise the Muniquep device to monitor speeds of vehicles at identified locations. Please be aware of the manner of your driving in the area and give consideration to whether you are near a school.

Our team is committed to keeping the community safe, preventing and detecting crime. If any suspicious activity is seen, please report this to us, either as an emergency on 999 or to the Service Centre on 101. Quick and effective reporting allows our team to react accordingly and maximise the opportunity to apprehend offenders.

Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.
