We have seen a rise in the number of break-ins to garages in June, with predominantly bicycles being stolen. We have an increased focus in the affected areas at present and are looking at additional crime prevention avenues we can explore.

#### Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

##### AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 6
- There were 2 Housebreakings (Garages)
- Vandalisms have decreased by 1
- There were 2 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 4

##### AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have increased by 6
- There were 5 Housebreaking (4 Garages, 1 house)
- Vandalisms have decreased by 3
- There were 4 Thefts from unlocked vehicle
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 3

### AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have increased by 2
- There were 3 Housebreaking (garages)
- Vandalisms have decreased by 4
- There were 4 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 1

### GENERAL INFORMATION

This month, a number of garages have been broken into. Push bikes are predominantly the target for these thieves. We have been leafletting affected areas to highlight the crimes but also to encourage the reporting of people hanging around these areas.

In the coming weeks we will be trying to raise awareness further with media messages and with some crime prevention 'surgeries' where we can pass on information and useful tips. We will advertise these in advance. We will also be liaising with cycle retailers in relation to this.

I would encourage anyone to utilise the free services on at [www.immobolise.com](http://www.immobolise.com) or at [www.bikeregister.com](http://www.bikeregister.com) for recording you bike (or any other property) serial numbers etc, so that in the event that it does go missing, you have the best chance of getting it returned.

My message is still to be vigilant and report anyone you feel is suspicious, especially if they are around lanes and garages. Most of our good recoveries come from people doing this.

The primary purpose of these e-mail addresses is for residents to report non-criminal queries, such as passing attentions, information, advice and non-criminal quality of life issues, such as youth annoyance. These e-mail addresses are not for reporting crimes or offences. The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.

Your comments and concerns are important to the staff of the West End CPT. This allows us to allocate our resources to the areas causing you the most concern. Should you have any
