Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 6
- There were 2 Housebreakings (Garage/Shed)
- Vandalisms have remained at 4
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 6

AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 10
- There was 1 Housebreaking (Home)
- Vandalisms have increased by 3
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 2

AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 3
- There were 0 Housebreakings

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- Vandalisms have remained at 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 8

GENERAL INFORMATION

A positive month, showing reduction in break-ins to sheds as well as a general reduction in crime across the areas.

The reasons can be wide and varied, but we will continue to offer crime prevention advice where we think it is necessary, particularly in areas that may be at risk, whilst promoting messages about home security and the importance of lights at this time of year.

Over the next three weeks we have dedicated patrols on some evenings patrolling streets and issuing crime prevention leaflets to try and reinforce the message. We are also supporting this with additional dedicated crime patrols at other times our analysis suggests are 'risk' periods.

Together with the fantastic support we already receive from our communities in relation to identifying possible thieves, we can hopefully ensure that everyone has a Merry Christmas (except maybe the thieves).

As the last report for 2016, can I just say that I genuinely appreciate the support my team receives from the Community Councils, Partners, Councillors and members of the public and I look forward to continuing this throughout 2017.

The primary purpose of these e-mail addresses is for residents to report non-criminal queries, such as passing attentions, information, advice and non-criminal quality of life issues, such as youth annoyance. The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.

Your comments and concerns are important to the staff of the West End CPT. This allows us to allocate our resources to the areas causing you the most concern. Should you have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to discuss these with the Officer attending your Community Council Meeting or by emailing the above e-mail addresses or our Service Centre.
