**Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:**

**AS3A – Ferryhill**

- Quality of life calls have increased by 2
- There were 2 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have increased by 3
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 3

**AS3B – Mannofield**

- Quality of life calls have increased by 2
- There were 2 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have remained the same
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 1

**AS3C – West End**

- Quality of life calls have increased by 1
- There were 8 Housebreakings

## NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED

- Vandalisms have decreased by 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 9

### GENERAL INFORMATION

As you can see, October saw a rise in both thefts from unlocked cars in all areas across our CPT. No one street in particular was targeted, but it has been fairly regular in occurrence. The importance of securing your vehicle cannot be overstated as a means of preventing this crime. It is an easy option from criminals, who are less likely to leave evidence at the scene where entry is not forced.

In addition the AS3C area has seen a spike in break-ins to sheds, where the other areas have fallen, with the majority occurring around the Queens Cross area.

With the clocks going back and darker nights we would remind you of our 'Lights out - You're Out' advice. It's good practice to leave a light on when you're out so as not to advertise the fact.

The primary purpose of these e-mail addresses is for residents to report non-criminal queries, such as passing attentions, information, advice and non-criminal quality of life issues, such as youth annoyance. These e-mail addresses are not for reporting crimes or offences. The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.

Your comments and concerns are important to the staff of the West End CPT. This allows us to allocate our resources to the areas causing you the most concern.
