**Summary**

There were 4 reports of Theft by Housebreaking in the Ferryhill area. The MO for these crimes are similar with all enquiries on going and CID Pro Active Officers involved.

There was 1 report of Theft by Housebreaking in the Mannofield area in relation to RS McColl's. Enquiries are on-going and being dealt with by a CID Officer.

There were 3 reports of Theft by Housebreaking in the West End. These enquiries are being dealt with by Community Policing Officers.

The theft of push bikes features regularly in the above crimes. I would ask people to review the security of their bikes and sheds and take action where required.

There were 2 section 57 (persons on property with the intention to commit theft) offences over the reporting period. The Ferryhill enquiry is on-going. A 35 year old male was apprehended and appeared from custody in relation to the Mannofield offence.

There were 4 incidents in relation to drugs in the Ferryhill area. These were not related and refer to smells of cannabis and suspected drug dealing from a vehicle.

There were no incidents in relation to drugs in the Mannofield area.

There were 2 incidents recorded in relation to drugs in the West End which may be linked. Police are monitoring the intelligence picture.

There were 10 reports of anti-social behaviour in the Ferryhill area. These appear to be separate incidents ranging from a report of a dirt bike, abusive males and females and youths setting off fireworks.

There were 4 reports of anti-social behaviour in the Mannofield area. These relate to youths throwing stones, eggs and fireworks on different nights and different locations.

There were 7 reports of anti-social behaviour in the West End including noisy youths and a drunk male being a nuisance.

There were 4 reported vandalisms in the Ferryhill area. They do not appear connected and all enquiries are on-going.

There were 2 reported vandalism in the Mannofield area. A 40 year old male and 24 year old female appeared from custody in relation to one of the incidents. The other enquiry is on-going.

There were 3 reported vandalisms in the West End. 2 are detected with a 45 year old male appearing from custody for one incident and a 62 year old male dealt with for an unrelated incident who was released to appear at a later date. The third enquiry is on-going.

Reported Road traffic collisions remain at the same level with no significant road traffic accidents in the area over the month of October 2017.

Over the reporting period Police have reported individuals for a number of crimes / offences including Road Traffic offences, Assault, Vandalism, Theft, Anti-Social Behaviour and Domestic incidents.

Our team is committed to keeping the community safe, preventing and detecting crime. If any suspicious activity is seen, please report this to us, either as an emergency on 999 or to the Service Centre on 101. Quick and effective reporting allows our team to react accordingly and maximise the opportunity to apprehend offenders.
