There were 3 housebreakings in the AS3B area this month but nothing linking them in time date or location. We continue to see low numbers of Garage break-ins.

There was a slight rise this month in vehicle crime across most areas.

### Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

#### AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have increased by 1
- There was 1 Housebreaking
- Vandalisms have increased by 3
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 2

#### AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have remained the same
- There were 5 Housebreakings (2 garages)

- Vandalisms have increased by 1
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 1

### **AS3C – West End**

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 4
- There were 0 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have increased by 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 3

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

As you will see above, there were a handful of thefts from unlocked motor cars. There were also 6 vehicles stolen. Of these, 4 were motor scooters and the other 2 were unsecured motor cars with the keys left within.

We have managed to detect the offenders for some of these, and we continue to circulate our security messages on social media to try and get owners to do their part in making their property hard to steal.

Last month, thefts from unlocked vehicle outweighed our vehicle 'break-ins' by 6 to 1. This mirrors previous months.

I would again say that the public are the best observers of what is normal for their street, and I would encourage you to report any suspicious vehicle or person hanging around your area to us so that we can get them checked. It is so often the case that sharp-eyed residents help us to detect crimes that would otherwise be undetected - just by following their instincts.

Just as a further reminder, now that the nights are dark, it's a good idea to remember the 'Lights out - You're out' message, and look out your timer switches. I anticipate we will do some leafletting in relation to this message in the near future.

The primary purpose of these e-mail addresses is for residents to report non-criminal queries, such as passing attentions, information, advice and non-criminal quality of life issues, such as youth annoyance. These e-mail addresses are not for reporting crimes or offences. The process for reporting any crimes or offences is to call 101 (Aberdeen Service Centre) who will log the call on our Command and Control system and allocate the incident to our area. Using this process negates the possibility of the report being missed and also ensures that the callers detail, addresses and telephone numbers are noted for our awareness and response.
