Overall the majority of areas saw low numbers of acquisitive crime in August. The overall rise in offences is attributable to the higher rate of possession of drugs cases, which is a result of proactive activity from Officers in my area.

Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have decreased by 7
- There were 0 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have decreased by 2
- There was 3 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 1

AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have increased by 4
- There was 1 Housebreaking (1 garage)
- Vandalisms have decreased by 1

NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED

- There were 2 Thefts from unlocked vehicles
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 11

AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have increased by 7
- There were 1 Housebreaking (1 house)
- Vandalisms have increased by 5
- There were 1 Theft from an unlocked vehicle
- Overall CrimeFile offences have decreased by 3

GENERAL INFORMATION

It was pleasing to see a maintaining of the lower figures relating to housebreakings in all areas. Whilst there are a number of external factors that will contribute to this reduction, there has been significant Police effort been put into the pushing of Crime Prevention messages.

This month will see carry out a Speeding initiative in conjunction with the pupils of Airyhall Primary. This has been done in previous years at Ferryhill Primary to great effect. It may even bag us some future Traffic Officers.
